



Be Safe....

Students are encouraged and supported to **Be Safe** in and around the school. This extends to the classroom, playground, toilets, during transitions and out in the community. We also encourage the use of these values at home and on weekends.

Teaching strategies...

Classroom

Students are encouraged to ask to leave the room through their preferred form of communication.

Model to students the safe way to move around the school, as well as provide visual reminders.

Visual reminders and social stories on 'Keeping hands and feet to myself'.

Toilets

Visual reminders will be placed in the bathroom area to remind students on expected behaviours.

Explicitly teach students each skill, such as how to turn taps off and wash hands correctly.

Playground

Reinforce safe behaviour on equipment and support students to use equipment safely.

Transitions

Use peer modelling to demonstrate listening to instructions.

Practise safe walking during a 'Walking program'. Practice staying together and responding to 'Stop'.

Toilets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pull my pants up when finished • Wash my hands with soap • Keep toilets clean • Turn off the taps
Playground	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use equipment safely • Be gentle with others
Transitions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen to instructions • Walk together • Stop when asked
Community Access	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Always stay with the group • Always wear a seatbelt on the bus • Follow road safety rules

Community Access

Use clear safety signs in the classroom and playground to teach road safety rules.

Identify safety signs in community.

Practise and remind students when moving around the school to 'stay together'.
